The November 5 Election is not too far around the corner and Early Voting Days have been scheduled for Williamson County in Liberty Hill. Early Voting is Monday, October 21 through Wednesday, October 30 from 8:00 am to 6:00 pm. Hours will be extended from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm beginning Thursday, October 31 and ending Friday, November 1. There is no voting on Sunday. All early voting is being conducted at Municipal Court located at 2801 Ranch Road 1869. After the November election, the City website will provide information regarding early voting locations, candidate packets and more for the May 2020 General Election.

SCULPTURE & HOT AIR BALLOON FESTIVAL

The Liberty Hill Sculpture Festival is reaching new heights with the addition of hot air balloons on Saturday, October 19!

The morning will kick off at 7:00 am at Lions Foundation Park with a raffle to win a ride in a Hot Air Balloon. A 5K Fun Run begins at 7:45 am. Visitors are encouraged to stay all morning to watch live sculpting demos in a variety of mediums, including stone, wood, metal, glass, sand and ice.

Children are invited to participate in hands-on art activities hosted by local businesses. Vendors, live

music and exhibitions, and food trucks will be open until 1:00 pm. The Sculpture Park will be open for self-guided tours from 8:00 am – 1:00 pm. The first 100 people to take a tour will receive a free ticket to the Hot Air Balloon Glow & Street Dance that evening.

The park will reopen at 7:00 pm for ticketed guests. The evening portion of the festival features a Hot Air Balloon Glow, street dance with headliner People's Choice Band, and a Silent Disco with three high-energy DJs.
