WHAT'S HAPPENING IN TOWN

The City of Liberty Hill is growing and undergoing many changes, and we look forward to keeping you up-to-date. There are several projects currently underway to help relieve traffic and parking conditions downtown, liven up our parks art and cultural activities to make Liberty Hill a destination point for residents and visitors.

Construction has started at Wetzel Park to complete a Splash Pad in early September.

A stop-light at 1869 and Loop 332 is under consideration. Adding a light signal and turn bays could elevate some of the current traffic jams. A few one-way streets are being considered for two-way traffic on a temporary basis.

Construction is anticipated to start at Stubblefield Phase I (Loop 332 to Falwell Drive) this Fall.
